Biographies of Members of the Politburo

General Secretary To Lam



General Tô Lâm, born on July 10, 1957, hometown Hung Yen province, was unanimously re-elected General Secretary of the Communist Party of Vietnam on January 23, 2026.

He has been a member of the Party Central Committee across its 11th to 14th terms and has served on the Politburo since the 12th term. Academically, he holds a Doctorate in Law and is a professor, having graduated from the People's Security University, one of Vietnam's premier institutions for security and law studies.

After graduating from the People's Security University, he began his career in 1979 at the Ministry of Public Security, advancing through roles in political protection and national security, including director-level positions and the ranks of Major General, Lieutenant General, Colonel General, and eventually General in January 2019. His leadership extended to positions such as Deputy Minister and Minister of Public Security, as well as Vice Head and then Head of the Central Steering Committee on Anti-Corruption, and Member of the National Defense and Security Council. During his tenure as Minister of Public Security (2016 – April 2024), he led a sweeping anti-corruption campaign that removed numerous high-level officials.

He initially assumed the role of Party General Secretary on August 3, 2024, following the death of his predecessor, Nguyen Phu Trong. In 2024, Tô Lâm briefly served as President of Vietnam, and later as both President and General Secretary, before continuing as General Secretary from October 2024 onward. His career reflects decades of service in both security and political leadership at the highest levels of Vietnam's government and Communist Party.

Tran Thanh Man

Chairman of the National Assembly



Trần Thanh Mẫn, born on August 12, 1962, hometown Can Tho Province, has been serving as Chairman of the National Assembly since May 2024 and Chairman of the National Election Council. He holds a Doctorate in Economics.

He has been a member of the Communist Party Central Committee from its 10th to 14th terms and has served on the Politburo since the 13th term. Holding a doctorate in economics, Trần Thanh Mẫn began his political career in youth and local government organizations in the Southern Hau Giang and Can Tho provinces, advancing through leadership positions including Chairman of the People's Committee of Can Tho City (2008–2010) and Can Tho province's Party Secretary (2011-2015). He later held senior roles in the Vietnam Fatherland Front, serving as Vice Chairman, Secretary-General, and Chairman. From 2019 to 2021, he was Vice Chairman of the National Assembly, before being elected its Chairman in May 2024. In 2025, he also became Chairman of the National Election Council, reflecting his central role in both legislative leadership and the organization of national elections in Vietnam.

Tran Cam Tu

Permanent Member of the 14th Party Secretariat



Trần Cẩm Tú, born on August 25, 1961, hometown Ha Tinh province, is a senior Vietnamese politician currently serving as Permanent Member of the Party Secretariat. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee from its 10th to 14th terms and has served on the Politburo since the 13th term. He holds a Doctorate in Economics and has a long career spanning both local governance and central Party oversight.

He began his career in the forestry and services sector in Ha Tinh province, advancing from deputy head to director of the Hương Sơn Forestry and Services Company between 1995 and 2004. He then transitioned into local government, serving as Vice Secretary and Chairman of the Hương Sơn District People's Committee, and later as Chairman of the Inspection Commission of the Hà Tĩnh Provincial Party Committee.

From 2007 to 2011, he held key positions in the Party's disciplinary apparatus, including membership and deputy chairmanship of the Central Inspection Commission. Between 2011 and

2015, he served as Secretary of the Thái Bình Provincial Party Committee before returning to the Central Inspection Commission, where he rose to Chairman from 2018 to 2024 and also served as Deputy Head of the Central Steering Committee on Anti-Corruption.

Le Minh Hung

Chairman of the Party Central Committee's Organisation Commission



Lê Minh Hưng, born on December 11, 1970, with hometown in Ha Tinh province. He is a prominent Vietnamese politician currently serving as Head of the Party Central Organization Commission. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since its 12th term and has served on the Politburo since the 13th term.

He began his career in 1993 at the State Bank of Vietnam in the Department of International Relations, working on matters related to the International Monetary Fund (IMF). From 1998 to 2002, he held leadership roles in the Asian Development Bank unit within the bank, and later advanced to Deputy Director and then Director of the Department of International Cooperation. Between 2010 and 2011, he served as Director of the Department of Personnel and Organization, before being appointed Deputy Governor of the State Bank in 2011. From 2016 to 2020, Lê Minh Hưng served as Governor of the State Bank of Vietnam, overseeing national monetary policy and banking regulation. At age 46, he was the youngest governor in the bank's history.

Following his tenure at the central bank, he transitioned to Party administration, serving as Chief of the Party Central Office from 2020 to 2024. In May 2024, he was appointed Head of the Party Central Organization Commission, and in June 2024 he assumed the role permanently, directing the Party's personnel, organizational strategy, and cadre management. He has also been elected as a member of the 15th National Assembly.

Academically, he holds a Master's degree in Public Policy and a Bachelor's degree in French. He used to attend IMF's Market Economics and Financial Analysis course at Shanghai University of Finance and Economics in 1996, followed by a Master's program in Economics at Saitama University, Japan (1996–1997). He is the son of the late Senior Lieutenant General Lê Minh Hương, who served as Vietnam's Minister of Public Security from 1996 to 2002.

Do Van Chien

Standing Vice Chairman of the National Assembly



Đỗ Văn Chiến, born on November 10, 1962, hometown Tuyên Quang province, is currently serving as Standing Vice Chairman of the National Assembly. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee from its 10th to 14th terms and has served on the Politburo since the 13th term. He holds a degree in Agricultural Engineering and has built a career spanning local governance, provincial leadership, and central government administration.

He began his career in 1986 as a staff member and later Deputy Head of the Administration and General Affairs Department at Vietnam National University of Agriculture III. He then worked in the tea industry, serving as Technical Assistant, Head of Production Planning, and Deputy Director of the Tân Trào Agro-Industrial Enterprise under the Vietnam Tea Corporation. Transitioning into government service, he held various leadership roles in Tuyên Quang province, including Deputy Secretary of the Provincial Party Committee and Chairman of the Tuyên Quang Provincial People's Committee (between 2001 and 2011) and later as Secretary of the Yên Bái Provincial Party Committee (2011–2015).

At the national level, he served as Vice Chairman and then Minister, Chairman of the Committee for Ethnic Minority Affairs (2015–2021), and later as Chairman of the Vietnam Fatherland Front (2021–2025). In January 2025, he became Standing Vice Chairman of the National Assembly and Deputy Secretary of the Party Committee of the National Assembly. He has also been elected as a National Assembly Deputy for the 13th, 14th, and 15th terms.

Bui Thi Minh Hoai

President of the Vietnam Fatherland Front Central Committee



Bùi Thị Minh Hoài, born on January 12, 1965, with hometown in Ninh Bình province. She is currently serving as President of the Vietnam Fatherland Front and Vice Chairwoman of the National Election Council. She has been a member of the Party Central Committee from its 10th to 14th terms and has served on the Politburo since the 13th term. She holds a Master's degree and a Bachelor's degree in Law.

Her career spans over three decades in public administration, Party discipline, and mass organizations. She began in local government and inspection roles in Nam Định and Hà Nam provinces before moving into

provincial leadership, including Chairwoman of the Hà Nam Provincial People's Council and Head of the Provincial Mass Mobilization Commission. At the national level, she served in the Central Inspection Commission (2011–2021), as Head of the Central Mass Mobilization Commission (2021–2024), and as a National Assembly deputy. In November 2025, she was appointed President of the Vietnam Fatherland Front, while also serving as Vice Chairwoman of the National Election Council.

General Phan Van Giang ***Minister of Defense***



General Phan Văn Giang, born on October 4, 1960, hometown in Nam Dinh (now Ninh Bình province), is a senior Vietnamese military officer and politician currently serving as Minister of National Defense and is member of the National Election Council. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee from its 12th to 14th terms and a member of the Politburo since the 13th term. He holds a Doctorate in Military Science.

He began his military career in 1978 as a soldier in Battalion 4, Regiment 677, Division 346, participating in combat operations in Cao Bằng. Over the following decades, he rose through the ranks of the People's Army of Vietnam, holding key command and staff positions including Company Commander, Battalion Chief of Staff, Regiment Commander, and Division Commander in Division 312 of Military Corps 1 of Vietnam People's Army. From 2010 to 2011, he served as Commander of Military Corps 1, before becoming Deputy Chief of the General Staff (2011–2014) and Deputy Minister of Defense (2016).

From 2016 to 2021, he was Chief of the General Staff of the Vietnam People's Army while also serving as Deputy Minister of Defense. In April 2021, he was appointed Minister of National Defense, overseeing Vietnam's military strategy, defense policy, and national security.

General Luong Tam Quang

Minister of Public Security



General Lương Tam Quang, born on October 17, 1965, hometown Hung Yen province, is a senior Vietnamese security official and politician currently serving as General and Minister of Public Security (MPS) and Chairman of the National Data Association (since March 2025). He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 13th term and a member of the Politburo since the same term. He holds bachelor's degrees in Criminal Investigation and Law.

He began his career in the public security sector in the early 1980s, receiving formal training at the Security Academy before being assigned to the External Intelligence Department at MPS, where he was involved in counterintelligence and overseas security operations. He later worked extensively within the Economic Security Department under the General Department of Security II, where he accumulated deep experience in complex security investigations and inter-agency coordination. Between 2010 and 2017, he served as Director of General Department of Economic Security, Deputy Chief of the Office and later as Chief of the Ministry's Office of MPS, where he coordinated policy implementation, operational planning, and cross-ministerial cooperation. During this period, he was promoted to the ranks of Major General and later Lieutenant General.

From 2019 to 2024, he served as Deputy Minister of Public Security and concurrently as Head of the Ministry's Security Investigation Agency. In June 2024, he was appointed Minister of Public Security, and in March 2025 he additionally assumed the role of Chairman of the National Data Association.

He was promoted to the rank of Major General in 2014, Lieutenant General in 2019, and General in 2024.

Nguyen Duy Ngoc

Secretary of the Party Committee of Hanoi City



Nguyễn Duy Ngọc, born in 1964, hometown Hưng Yên province, is currently serving as Secretary of the Hanoi Party Committee. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since its 13th term and a member of the Politburo since the same term. He holds a Master's degree in Law.

Nguyễn Duy Ngọc began his career in law enforcement, serving in leadership roles within the Hanoi Police Department, including Head of Thanh Trì District Police, Head of the Traffic Police Department, and later as Deputy Director of Hanoi Police. In 2016, he became Deputy Director of the General Department of Police of the Ministry of Public Security (MPS), simultaneously leading the department responsible for investigating corruption, economic crimes, and smuggling. He was promoted to Major General in 2017, Lieutenant General in 2021, and Colonel General in 2023.

From 2019 to 2024, he served as Deputy Minister of Public Security and Vice Chairman of the National Traffic Safety Committee, overseeing national policing and investigative operations.

Between 2024 and 2025, he held multiple senior Party positions, including Secretary of the 13th Party Central Committee and Chief of the Office of the Party Central Committee. In January 2025, he was appointed a member of the Politburo and became Deputy Head of the Standing Board of the Central Steering Committee for Science, Technology, Innovation, and Digital Transformation, while continuing his roles as Secretary of the Party Central Committee and Chief of the Party Office, as well as simultaneously taking on the position of Chairman of the Central Inspection Commission. In November 2025, he was appointed Secretary of the Hanoi Party Committee.

General Nguyen Trong Nghia

Chairman of the General Political Department of the Vietnam People's Army



General Nguyễn Trọng Nghĩa, born on March 6, 1962, hometown Dong Thap province, is currently serving as Chairman of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 12th term and a member of the Politburo since the 13th term. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Social Sciences and Humanities.

He began his military career in 1988 in Regiment 23, Military Region 7, serving in political officer roles and rising through the ranks from Senior Lieutenant to Lieutenant Colonel while leading political departments at the regiment level. Between 2000 and 2009, he served in the Political Department of Military Region 7, including as Political Commissar of the 5th Division, combining leadership of military units with Party responsibilities at the divisional level.

From 2010 to 2017, he advanced to Major General and then Lieutenant General, serving as Political Commissar of Military Corps 4 and later as Deputy Head of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army. During this period, he also served as a National Assembly delegate and held leadership positions in the Vietnam Fatherland Front and the Central Military Party Committee.

Between 2021 and 2025, he held key Party roles including Secretary of the Party Central Committee and Head of the Central Propaganda Department, and from 2025, he became Head of the Central Propaganda and Mass Mobilization Department while also joining the National Election Council. In November 2025, he was appointed General and Head of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army, as well as a member of the Politburo and Standing Member of the Central Military Party Committee.

General Trinh Van Quyet

Chairman of Central Commission for Publicity, Education, and Mass Mobilization



General Trịnh Văn Quyết, born on January 22, 1966, hometown Hai Duong (now Hai Phong city), currently serves as Chairman of the Central Commission for Publicity, Education and Mass Mobilization. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 13th term and a member of the Politburo since the 14th term. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Party and State Governance and was promoted to General in July 2025.

He began his career in the Vietnam People's Army, rising through political leadership positions, including Deputy Political Commissar of Military Region 2 in 2015 and Political Commissar of Military Region 2 in 2016. From 2021 to 2024, he served as Deputy Chairman of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army and Chairman from June 2024 to November 2025.

In November 2025, he was appointed Chairman of the Central Commission for Publicity, Education and Mass Mobilization and concurrently became a member of the National Election Council.

Le Hoai Trung

Minister of Foreign Affairs



Lê Hoài Trung, born on April 27, 1961, hometown Hue, is a senior Vietnamese diplomat and politician, currently serving as Minister of Foreign Affairs (MOFA). He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 12th term. He holds a Doctorate in Law and a Master's degree in International Law and Diplomacy. In 1993, he earned his Master's degree from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University.

He began his career in 1982 at the MOFA, working in the Department of General Political Affairs (now the Department of International Organizations). Early in his career, he served at Vietnam's Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York, progressing from Attaché to Third Secretary, and later to Minister-Counselor and Deputy Permanent Representative.

From December 2010 to July 2011, he served as Deputy Foreign Minister and member of MOFA's Party Committee. Between 2011 and 2014, he was Deputy Foreign Minister, Ambassador

Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary and Permanent Representative of Vietnam to the UN. From 2014 to 2016, he continued as Deputy Foreign Minister, overseeing Southeast Asia, South Asia, South Pacific, ASEAN affairs, serving as Head of ASEAN SOM, and President of Vietnam National Commission for UNESCO.

Between 2016 and 2021, he held expanded responsibilities as Deputy Foreign Minister, managing departments for International Organizations, Northeast Asia, Cultural Diplomacy, UNESCO, International Law and Treaties, Democracy and Human Rights, and development cooperation in the Mekong region. He also served as Head of the National Border Committee and President of Vietnam National Commission for UNESCO.

From March 2021 to February 2025, he was a member of the Central Committee and the Secretariat of the Communist Party, serving as Chairman of the Commission for External Relations and as a National Assembly deputy. From February to August 2025, he also served as Chief of Office of the Party Central Committee, and from August to October 2025, as Acting Foreign Minister. He was formally appointed Minister of Foreign Affairs in October 2025.

Le Minh Tri

Permanent Vice Chairman of the Party Central Committee's Commission for Internal Affairs



Lê Minh Trí, born on November 1, 1960, hometown Ho Chi Minh City, is a senior Vietnamese political and legal official, currently serving as Deputy Head of the Standing Board of the Central Committee for Internal Affairs. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 12th term, a member of the Politburo since the 14th term, and became Secretary of the Party Central Committee during its 13th term. He holds degrees in Public Security and Law. He began his career in law enforcement in 1978 at the Ho Chi Minh City Police Officer Training School and later served in the Personnel and Training Departments of Ho Chi Minh City Police. Between 1990 and 2000, he served as Deputy Head of Department A12b, Ministry of the

Interior (now Ministry of Public Security), and as a security officer at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel assigned as secretary to the Chairman of the Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee. From 2000 to 2002, he was Deputy Chief of the Office of the City People's Council and People's Committee. He subsequently held leadership positions in District 11 and District 1 as Chairman of the People's Committees and Deputy Secretary of District Party Committees, before becoming Vice Chairman of the Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee from 2010 to 2013.

In 2013, he was appointed Deputy Head of the Central Committee for Internal Affairs, later serving as Deputy Head and was elected to the Party Central Committee in 2016.

From 2016 to 2024, he held the positions of Chief Prosecutor of the Supreme People's Procuracy of Vietnam, member of the Central Steering Committees on Anti-Corruption and Judicial Reform. From August 2024 to November 2025, he was Chief Justice of the Supreme People's Court. In November 2025, he assumed his current role as Deputy Head of the Standing Board of the Central Committee for Internal Affairs, overseeing internal affairs and judicial administration at the national level.

Tran Luu Quang

Party Secretary of Ho Chi Minh City



Trần Lưu Quang, born on August 30, 1967, hometown Tay Ninh province, currently serves as Secretary of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee. He holds a Master's degree in Public Administration and a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

Over his career, he has held various positions in Tây Ninh, including Deputy Director of the Department of Planning and Investment, Chairman of the People's Committee, and Secretary of the Trảng Bàng District Party Committee. He later served as Deputy Chairman of Tây Ninh Province, then as Secretary of the Tây Ninh Provincial Party Committee and Chairman of the Provincial People's Council.

From 2019 to 2021, he was Deputy Secretary of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee, followed by leadership roles as Secretary of the Hai Phong Party Committee (2021 – 2023). He served as Deputy Prime Minister of Vietnam from 2021 to 2024, Head of the Central Economic Commission briefly from August 2024 to January 2025, and Head of the Central Policy and Strategy Commission from January 2025 – August 2025. Since August 2025, he has been the Secretary of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee, and he is also a member of the Politburo and the Party Central Committee. He has represented Ho Chi Minh City in the National Assembly during its 14th and 15th terms.

Pham Gia Tuc

Chief of the Party Central Committee's Office



Phạm Gia Túc, born on May 20, 1965, hometown Ninh Binh, currently serves as Chief of the Office of the Party Central Committee. He holds a Master's degree in Public Administration and a Bachelor's degree in Economics.

He began his career as Vice Chairman of the Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry (VCCI) before transitioning to Party and government roles. He served as Deputy Secretary of the Can Tho Municipal Party Committee from 2014 to 2017, then moved to the central level as Deputy Head of the Central Internal Affairs

Commission and Secretary of its Party Committee. In 2021, he was elected to the Party Central Committee and appointed Secretary of the Nam Dinh Provincial Party Committee.

In November 2024, he became Deputy Chief of the Office of the Party Central Committee, and since August 2025, he has held the position of Chief of the Office.

Tran Sy Thanh

Chairman of the Party Central Committee's Inspection Commission



Trần Sỹ Thanh, born on March 16, 1971, hometown Nghe An province, is a senior Vietnamese politician and economist, currently serving as Chairman of the Central Inspection Commission (13th term). He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 11th term (initially as an alternate) and has served on the Politburo since the 14th term. Academically, he holds a Master's degree in Economics.

He began his public service career in 1999 at the State Treasury under the Ministry of Finance, progressing from Deputy Head of the Planning and General Affairs Department to Chief of Office, and later serving as Deputy General Director (2006–2008). He then held provincial leadership roles, including Deputy Chairman and Deputy Party Secretary of Đăk Lăk (2008–2011) and Party Secretary of Bắc Giang (2012–2015) and Lạng Sơn (2015–2017). He was briefly a Member of the Party Central Inspection Commission from 2011 to 2012.

From 2017 to 2020, he served at the national level as Deputy Head of the Central Economic Commission and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Vietnam National Oil and Gas Group. He subsequently became Deputy Chief of the National Assembly Office (2020-2021) and then

State Auditor General (2021-2022). Between 2022 and 2025, he held key leadership roles in Hanoi, including Deputy Secretary of the Party Committee, Chairman of the Hanoi People's Committee, and Secretary of the Party Committee of the Hanoi People's Committee.

In November 2025, he was appointed Chairman of the Party Central Inspection Commission, a position overseeing party discipline and anti-corruption efforts across Vietnam.

Nguyen Thanh Nghi

Chairman of the Party Central Committee's Commission for Policies and Strategies



Nguyễn Thanh Nghi, born on August 12, 1976, hometown Ca Mau province, is Head of the Central Policy and Strategy Commission and is the youngest member of the elected to the 14th Politburo. He holds a Doctorate in Construction Engineering and an engineering degree, and completed graduate studies at George Washington University in the United States.

He began his career as a lecturer at Ho Chi Minh City University of Architecture, later serving as Head of the Postgraduate Training and International Relations Office and then Deputy Principal of the university. Entering government service, he was appointed Deputy Minister of Construction (2011–2014), before holding provincial leadership roles in Kiên Giang from 2014 to 2016, including Deputy Secretary, Party Secretary, secretary of the Provincial Military Party Committee, and head of the provincial National Assembly delegation. At the 12th National Congress of the Party in 2016, he was elected as a member of the Party Central Committee, while continued his various roles in Kien Giang until 2020.

In 2020, he returned to the Ministry of Construction as Deputy Minister and, in 2021, became Minister of Construction, serving as both Party Secretary of the Ministry and Minister until early 2025. In 2025, he briefly held senior Party roles in Ho Chi Minh City, including Permanent Deputy Secretary of the City Party Committee and Party Secretary of City Party Agencies.

In August 2025, the Politburo appointed him as Head of the Central Policy and Strategy Commission. At the 14th Party Congress in January 2026, he was re-elected to the Party Central Committee and subsequently appointed to the Politburo. Nguyen Thanh Nghi is the eldest son of former Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyễn Tấn Dũng. His younger brother Nguyen Minh Triet (born 1988) was also elected as alternate member of the 14th Party Central Committee.

Doan Minh Huan

Permanent Vice President of the Ho Chi Minh National Academy of Politics



Đoàn Minh Huấn, born on April 3, 1971, hometown Ha Tinh, is a senior Vietnamese political scholar and Party official, currently serving as Permanent Vice President of the Ho Chi Minh National Academy of Politics. He has been a member of the Party Central Committee since the 12th term (as an alternate) and through the 13th and 14th terms, and was appointed to the Politburo in the 14th term. He holds a PhD in Party History and is an Associate Professor.

His career in political education and Party publications spans over a decade, beginning as Deputy Director and later Director of the Regional Academy I under the National Academy of Politics (2010–2013). He subsequently served as Deputy Editor-in-Chief and Editor-in-Chief of *Communist Review* (2016–2017), one of the primary theoretical and political organs of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.

From 2023 to 2025, he was Secretary of the Party Committee of Ninh Binh Province, overseeing provincial administration and Party affairs, before returning in July 2025 to the National Academy of Politics as Vice President.

Tran Duc Thang

Minister of Agriculture and Environment



Trần Đức Thắng, born on August 11, 1973, hometown Phu Tho, currently serves as Minister of Agriculture and Environment. He is a member of the 13th and 14th Party Central Committees and the 14th Politburo. He holds a PhD and a Master's in Economics, and a Bachelor's in Finance and Banking.

He began his career in public service in 1995 at the Ministry of Finance, initially working as an inspector in the General, Administrative, and Construction Inspection Departments. Over the following years, he advanced through leadership roles, serving as Deputy Director of the Department of State Assets Management (2009-2011), Deputy Chief of the Office and Secretary to the Minister of Finance (2011-2013) and then Director of the Department of State Assets

Management. From 2018 to 2021, he was a member and then Deputy Head of the Central Inspection Commission, overseeing Party discipline and compliance matters.

He was Secretary of the Hải Dương Provincial Party Committee from 2022 to 2025 and briefly served as Permanent Deputy Chief of the Government Inspectorate. In July 2025, he became Acting Minister of Agriculture and Environment and was confirmed as Minister in October 2025.
