

Peter Cleveland is Vice President of the Government and Policy Group (GPG) at the Intel Corporation. He is responsible for establishing favorable legal, regulatory, statutory and market rules and policies to enable Intel's global business success.

Cleveland oversees a team of attorneys and policy professionals worldwide and acts as the company's public policy liaison to foreign governments and regulatory bodies as well as the U.S. Congress and Trump Administration in Washington, DC.
